GMTA Award Fund. *Established in 1993 to include honorary and memorial gifts, and awarded at the discretion of the GMTA Finance Advisory Committee. (Donations received without a specific designation will be deposited into this fund.)*

GMTA Broadhurst Award Fund. *Established in 1992 by the Broadhurst family in commemoration of Joan Broadhurst, and given annually at the GMTA Conference to the MTNA Junior Piano Performance Competition winner of the Georgia state-level competition. Award amount is 90% of earnings for that year.*

GMTA Composition Award Fund. *Established in 1987, initially funded by Betty Nolting and given annually at the GMTA Conference to first-place winners in the MTNA Student Composition Competitions for the Georgia state-level competitions in each age category. Award amount is 90% of earnings for that year plus any subsidy from the GMTA operation fund, divided by the number of first-place winners.*
