The live performances by our MTNA and GMTA winners in three recitals are always a highlight of the conference. The Auditions concerto winners will be featured on Thursday night.



#### dear delightful hollow square

The 2024 commissioned work is funded by Music Teachers National Association and Georgia MTA.

Inspired by traditional shape-note or Sacred Harp singing, dear delightful hollow square gets its title from physical set-up of the four vocal parts: trebles, altos, tenors, and basses. The piece places the audience inside the middle of the hollow square, with the four encircling speakers passing off live modulation of prerecorded vocals, spoken text, and instrumental textures. The Sacred Harp tradition, originating in New England, became increasingly more popular with the 1844 publication of the tunebook, The Sacred Harp, collected and edited by Benjamin Franklin White and Elisha J. King, who both lived in Georgia at the time. I combined traditional hymn texts, implied shape-note melodies, and the imitative contrapuntal style of the tunes with contemporary compositional techniques to create my own modern interpretation and representation of the experience of being within the hallowed hollow square.

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#### MICHELLE CANN

#### **Conference Recitalist**

Lauded as "exquisite" by *The Philadelphia Inquirer* and "a pianist of sterling artistry" by *Gramophone*, **MICHELLE CANN** is one of the most sought-after pianists of her generation. Recent engagements include appearances with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, The Cleveland Orchestra, The Philadelphia Orchestra, and the Los Angeles Philharmonic. Her honors include the Sphinx Medal of Excellence and the Andrew Wolf Chamber Music Award. In 2024, she was named the inaugural Christel DeHaan Artistic Partner of the American Pianists Association, responsible for artistic oversight of the American Pianists Awards.



Highlights of Cann's 2024-25 season include appearances with the San Francisco Symphony, the Cincinnati Symphony, and London's

Philharmonia Orchestra. She performs solo and collaborative recitals on prominent series such as the 92nd Street Y, New York; Duke University; the Royal Conservatory of Music; and Shriver Hall Concert Series. She also performs a recital as the headline artist at the National Conference of the Music Teachers National Association.

Recognized as a leading interpreter of the piano music of Florence Price, Cann performed the New York City premiere of Price's *Piano Concerto in One Movement* with The Dream Unfinished Orchestra in 2016. Her recording of the concerto with the New York Youth Symphony won a Grammy Award in 2023 for Best Orchestral Performance. Her acclaimed debut solo album *Revival*, featuring music by Price and Margaret Bonds, was released in 2023.

Cann holds bachelor's and master's degrees in piano performance from the Cleveland Institute of Music and an Artist's Diploma from the Curtis Institute of Music. She joined the Curtis piano faculty in 2020 as the inaugural Eleanor Sokoloff Chair in Piano Studies. She is also on the piano faculty of the Manhattan School of Music.

In 2023, he won the Rachel Howard Sonata/Sonatina late advanced category and was named an Outstanding Performer at the GMTA Piano Grade 10. He also received the Outstanding Performer award at the 2022 NDMTA Piano Bach Competition. In addition to his piano accomplishments, Ian has distinguished himself as an excellent string player. He was awarded 2nd alternate at the 2023 GMTA Instrumental

Concerto, has served as a violinist in the Georgia All-State Orchestras for four years and is currently a member of the Atlanta Youth Symphony Orchestra. He is also a dedicated leader in the Lambert High School Chamber Orchestra.

YOON KYUNG JANG Yoon Kyung Jang is a pianist from Seoul, South Korea. She started playing piano at the age of seven. She attended a Korea National University of Arts pre-college program. At the age of thirteen, she was selected by the 'Talented Arts Program' organized by the Seoul National Education Center where she studied. When she was fourteen, she was accepted by the Sunhwa Arts School. Since then, she attended the Sunhwa Arts Music School, the Sunhwa Arts High School, and Yonsei University in Seoul, where she studied under Mun-Jung Kim, Ma-ri Kwon, and Professor Young-Ran Han respectively. She won an achievement award at the Sunhwa Arts School allowing her to graduate from Yonsei University in 2013 with a 4-year full scholarship. She continued her studies in Germany, completing her master's course at the Hochschule für Musik "Hanns Eisler" Berlin with Professor Gabriele Kupfernagel from 2013 to 2015, and her Konzertexamen at



the Hochschule für Musik Detmold with Professor Jacob Leuschner from April 2016 to February 2018. Before moving to the United States in 2019, Yoon Kyung was an instructor at Yonsei University and Sunhwa Arts School. Under her tutelage, many students were admitted to prestigious universities in South Korea.

**ETHAN GOH**, a fifteen year-old, began his musical studies with piano at age 6 and is nearing his fourth year as a cellist. He has performed as a member of various youth orchestras, notably as the principal cellist of the Atlanta Symphony Youth Orchestra, the assistant principal of the All-state GMEA Orchestra for two years, and the Emory Youth Symphony Orchestra. Recently, Ethan auditioned for the Georgia Music Teachers Association, placing as Conference Recitalist for both the string concerto and 9th grade divisions.
