

GMTA EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING MINUTES

April 18, 2015 11:15 a.m.

Hugh Hodgson School of Music, University of Georgia, Room 308

President Robin Engleman called the meeting to order.

The minutes from the August 23, 2014 and November 8, 2014 meetings were approved.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS

President: Robin Engleman

GMTA is moving along!

In mid-December, after narrowing a well qualified slate of candidates from six down to three, the selection committee (Susan Andrews, Keith DeFoor, Dawn McCord, Tom Pearsall, Edith Sweatman and I) emerged from the interviews fully convinced that GMTA should retain Mandy Reynolds as our 2nd Executive Director. I am happy to report that Mandy has been delightful. Look for an article about her in the Summer GMTA Newsletter.

I joined the MTNA Competition winners from Georgia at the Southern Division Meetings and Competitions at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville, Tennessee, in January. I served as an indoor monitor for two of the competitions, attended Southern Division meetings, cheered on our Georgia students and enjoyed the fellowship with other Southern Division State Presidents. GMTA garnered nine awards total.

The winners represented us at the MTNA Conference in Las Vegas, Nevada in March. We had four national participants (Chamber Music Strings, Chamber Music Winds, Composition, Young Artist Performance Woodwinds). Out of those, we had two second place winners (Chamber Music Strings and Composition). Congratulations to the teachers in Georgia and their excellent students! I am excited to add that GMTA allotted \$3,300 for travel grants for these students who competed in Knoxville and Las Vegas.

In Las Vegas, I again monitored for two of the competitions and attended meetings and forums dedicated to meeting the goals of our organization as well as hearing many fine performances and masterclasses – Sir James and Lady Jeanne Galway, The Canadian Brass, Anne Schein, Lang Lang, Scott McBride Smith to name a few.

As we meet today in this building, we are flanked by many pre-college piano students and teachers competing in and diligently working the last weekend of the third year of our reorganized GMTA Auditions. Many thanks to Cathy Thacker, VP Auditions, who has worked tirelessly to make this year's Auditions the best possible experience for students and teachers alike. As one chair from last weekend commented, "Cathy Thacker certainly was the bright spot through all the Auditions.

Since the last Executive Board meeting in November, an ad hoc committee consisting of Jonathan Klein, Chair Cathy Thacker, VP Auditions and Betty Atkins, President Augusta MTA, have worked to propose a fee structure for non-member participation in GMTA Auditions, an FTC requirement. It has been approved by the FAC and will be presented at the Executive Board meeting for approval on April 18th. Thank you for your excellent work!

Plans have been underway in preparation for the GMTA Conference at Agnes Scott College in Decatur this November. The plans for the Conference are on schedule and we will hear fantastic headliners, Ian Hobson and Ingrid Clarfield, awesome Georgia's Own sessions. We will also get to meet our newly installed MTNA President, Rebecca Johnson. I am looking forward to seeing many of my friends there - college faculty, collegiate members and independent teachers alike. Look for information about the conference as well as other GMTA activities in the Summer GMTA Newsletter (mid-June) and in emails which will be sent throughout the summer.

Our 2016 GMTA Conference was to have been at Reinhardt College. These plans have changed. Joy Poole and I are looking for a new location.

The 2015 GMTA Conference will be held at Agnes Scott College in Decatur.

Conference Recitalist will be Ian Hobson, University of Illinois (http://ianhobson.net/bio.html) "...one of the finest pianists of his generation" (American Record Guide).

Conference Pedagogy Headliner will be Ingrid Clarfield (http://ingridclarfield.com/home.asp), nationally recognized teacher, clinician, pianist, and Professor of Piano and Coordinator of the Piano Department at Westminster Choir College of Rider University in Princeton, New Jersey.

Commissioned Composer will be Greg McLean (http://gregmclean.net). Greg is a nationally recognized composer and musician.

Master Classes will be held by both Conference Recitalist and Conference Pedagogy Headliner. 50 year members will be honored with a reception on Thursday evening following the evening concert.

Twenty-seven proposals have been submitted for the conference from Georgia's Own. Local associations will be asked to provide door prizes for each session.

Vice-President Membership: Jane Lester

MTNA had come up with a Membership Drive Campaign Handbook. This is located on the MTNA Website. It includes new member recruiting and member retention ideas. I have included the retention ideas in my report and have shared this with the LAPS.

RENTENTION IDEAS

For New Members:

Welcoming Packet. A welcome letter or email from the state or local association president with a thank you and an invitation to the group's next meeting sets a positive tone with the new member. Although time-consuming, a follow-up phone call from the president or a local contact is a wonderful personal touch that is well worth the effort if it results in more active, satisfied members. (Personal interaction with new members is the best way to get them involved and ensure they stay involved in your association's activities.)

First-time Meeting Buddy System. Establish a committee of existing members that will be assigned to call new members to invite them to the next association meeting. Then the "buddy" greets the new members at the meeting and introduces them to other members to ease any initial apprehension. Some associations even go do far as to establish a rule that is a new member is present at a meeting or function, no two officers can talk to each other. They must talk with the new members.

First-year Member Reception At State Convention. Have your state president host a reception – open to all members – during which first-year members are recognized by the group. Think of all you can do to make them feel welcome and included.

Association Newsletter. List new members in each issue of your newsletter. Encourage established members to call and welcome them to the group.

Scholarships. Local associations award scholarships to a certain number of new members each year to attend state conference.

Mentoring. Ask seasoned teachers and long-time MTNA members to mentor new members. Pairing new members with veteran members will encourage the new members' participation in your group's activities and will result in increased member satisfaction and retention. Some suggested guidelines for a mentoring program are included in the next section of this handbook.

Retention Ideas For All Members:

Programming: Plan programs that are diverse, comprehensive and applicable to all members of your association. Be sensitive to members' schedules and locations by offering alternative times and locations for meetings and activities throughout the year. Use varying means of communication to spread the word – newsletters, telephone calls, surveys, newspapers, television, radio, email and so on.

Provide seminars and programs for the new teacher getting started in the teaching field (business aspects of running a studio and so on). Provide child care.

Assist members in getting reconnected to a new local association after they move.

Encourage meetings and activities that appeal to the non-pianist.

Provide assistance for members who need financial assistance in order to attend the state conference (registration, conference meals, carpooling).

Arrange carpooling for monthly local association meetings.

Go after non-renewals. Find out why they did not renew. Look for trends and make adjustments (types of programs, more fellowship, and the like).

Keep up-to-date in technology – use in association records and communication, plan programs on the use of technology in the teaching studio.

Hold state-wide competitions or festivals for all instruments and voice.

Keep members informed through local and state newsletters/websites. Include materials for festivals and auditions, membership directories, member handbooks, links to other resources, events, awards and pedagogical articles.

- -Work younger members into leadership positions.
- -Develop quality activities for students of members.
- -Educate independent teachers on ways they can become full-time.
- -Give IMT's ideas for affording to attend the national conference.
- -Get members involved in all facets of MTNA: local, state and national. Encourage them to read the journals, visit MTNA website, become certified, enter students in the competitions, serve and recruit.

Vice-President, GMTA Auditions: Cathy Thacker

2015 Auditions is successful so far. The Regional Coordinators, Organizers, and State Chairs have worked very hard to ensure that the events go smoothly. This year saw the GATE theory test being introduced to all Pre-College Piano entrants.

We have a total of 656 students this year participating in the Regional and State Auditions. This is an increase from last year's total number of 636. 12th grade Piano has almost doubled in the last two years (20 in 2013), and Strings/Guitar has more than doubled (42 in 2013).

Region I – 115 Grade 12 - 39

Region II – 98 Concerto - 13

Region III – 32 WW/Brass - 4

Region IV – 112 Strings/Guitar – 87

Region V - 112 Voice - 16

College Piano - 28

There were 272 Theory participants.

I strongly recommend adding a work requirement for the teachers who enter students in Auditions. Some local associations have this rule, but it is desirable at the regional and state level as well. "Many hands make light work."

Vice-President, MTNA Competitions: Carol Payne

The stage is set for the competitions to be held the weekend of Oct. 29 – Nov. 1. We will be hosted by Clayton State University again this year. Senior Piano Competitions will be held in Spivey Hall.

I have been in touch with our various state coordinators, Junior, Senior, and Young Artist, and one of them has already received an inquiry about the competitions. Presently, I am starting to contact judges to invite them to participate and have several confirmed. Robin

updated our information on the MTNA Competitions page, so we are all set for the registration this fall!

It states in the GMTA Procedural Manual that the VP/Auditions and the VP/MTNA Competitions should "review the judges fees/compensation report annually" and "recommendations should be presented to the FAC." In advance of this meeting, I contacted all the people who hold similar positions to mine in the other states of the Southern Division to find out how they compensate their MTNA competition judges. Only two states provided answers so far, Florida and Alabama, both of whom differ widely from each other and from Georgia. If other states respond, I will include that information in my report for the next GMTA Board meeting.

We had several honors received by our students at the Southern Division and National Competitions:

- High school student Luka Marinkovic, student of Jeannine Morrison, won the Southern Division, and subsequently was awarded Second Place in the National Senior Composition Competition for his piano composition.
- Gabriel Pique, saxophonist, and student of Connie Frigo at UGA won the Southern Division Young Artist Woodwinds Competition.
- Gabriel Pique also is a member of "Milk," a woodwind chamber ensemble from UGA that won the Southern Division Chamber Music, Woodwind Competition. Connie Frigo is the teacher/coach of "Milk."
- The Columbus String Quartet, taught/coached by Sergiu Schwarz, won the Southern Division Young Artist Chamber Music Strings, and subsequently was awarded Second Place in the National Young Artist Chamber Music, Strings Competition.

The 28th annual Arts Advocacy Day was held in Washington, D.C. on March 23 & 24. Each year, attendees are inspired by lectures intended to stimulate dialogue on policy and social issues affecting the arts. This year Norman Lear gave a moving lecture to a sold-out crowd, and the Atlanta Symphony Youth Orchestra added inspiring musical performances to the program.

News From Collegiate Chapters

Kennesaw State University Collegiate Chapter, (KSU-MTNA)

Beth Anne Ake and Soyoun Sheehan, officers of KSU-MTNA performed at the Scholarship Winners Recital in CCMTA monthly meeting on 3/6/2015. Four officers of KSU-MTNA presented three individual posters and one group poster on piano pedagogy topics at the 20th KSU Annual Symposium of Student Scholars on 4/16/2015. In May, KSU-MTNA will organize the third music festival for local pre-college students at KSU.

Reinhardt Collegiate Chapter, "Naturally Sharp"

At our meeting after the Collegiate Colloquium at KSU on Jan. 24th, 2015, we elected our officers for 2015-16. Two of the events that we talked about attending were the Collegiate Chapters National Symposium at University of South Carolina in Columbia, SC, and the GMTA Collegiate Colloquium in 2016. On March 21st, 2015, 8 members from our chapter visited the Emeritus Senior Center in Canton to present musical selections and lead the residents in singing hymns. We visited with them before and after the music presentations. On April 21st, 2015, we will have our end-of-year party when we will go out to eat and then go bowling. We plan to have a meeting of the Naturally Sharp Executive Board members in August, 2015, to plan our activities for next year.

Finance/Advisory Committee: Susan Andrews

Advertisers and those who wish to make donations to GMTA may now make online credit card payments using the website.

In order to comply with GMTA Bylaws and FTC regulations, Local Associations are being asked to submit their governing documents (Constitution, Bylaws) electronically to the GMTA office by June 1. They will be reviewed by Dawn McCord. Two copies will be kept on file in the GMTA office, and the documents will then be sent to the MTNA office.

GMTA files are stored in Carbonite online backup. The Executive Director will research methods of also scanning historic GMTA documents into Carbonite.

BUDGET:

Students who participated in Southern Division competitions received travel grants in the amount of \$130, and those who went on to MTNA received an additional \$130. One student who participated in chamber music and solo performance received double that amount.

GMTA will contribute \$50 for hospitality at the annual College Chapter Colloquium, and will be included in the budget under miscellaneous expenses.

Box lunches will be provided for the college student members who pre-register for the conference. Funds for this will come from the 2014-2015 budget surplus.

Four \$400 GMTA Grants will be offered in 2015. Collegiate student members are eligible to apply for the grants, and they must indicate how the grant will be used. Active GMTA members may also apply and may use the grant for teacher education or student scholarship. These grants, as well as the Steinway Grants, will be publicized in the summer issue of the GMTA Newsletter. \$400 was also budgeted for certification stipends.

The Executive Director's contract will be renewed as of July 1 for a period of two years. The Executive Director will update her job description and present it to the FAC for review in August. Thereafter, the job description and contract will be evaluated and renewed in odd-numbered years.

The Piano Judges' List will now be called the Judges' List and will include judges of other instruments.

The decision was made to temporarily discontinue the sale of mailing labels until further study can be conducted regarding sharing of members' contact information.

ACTION ITEMS FOR THE EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING:

The FAC proposes that the Website Chair position be eliminated. Web editing and updates will be done by the Executive Director, with oversight provided by the GMTA President. This passed.

The GMTA Procedural Manual states that any GMTA Teacher of the Year who is declared MTNA Teacher of the Year will receive honorary lifetime membership in GMTA. The FAC proposes to expand the criteria used in considering candidates for GMTA honorary lifetime membership as follows: In addition to demonstrating exemplary service to the Association and to the music teaching profession, the candidate must meet one of the following requirements: 1) served as an MTNA officer; 2) designated an MTNA Foundation Fellow. The presentation of honorary lifetime membership must be approved by the FAC and the Executive Board. The bios of current Honorary Lifetime GMTA Members will be posted on the Member Honors page of the GMTA website. This passed.

The FAC proposes that a statement regarding the Code of Ethics be placed on the GMTA Website. It will include a link to the MTNA Code of Ethics. Local Associations are encouraged to make the same statement on their websites and in their bylaws, procedural manuals and/or directories. This passed.

The FAC proposes the fee structure for non-member participation in GMTA Auditions.

Fee Structure for Non-Members Participating in GMTA Competitive Events

Georgia MTA is in the final stages of becoming fully compliant with the April 3, 2014 Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") Antitrust settlement with Music Teachers National Association. One of the tenets of this

antitrust compliance is offering access to competitive events to non-members of GMTA and its affiliates. The

FTC's rational for this is the belief that "for music teachers, the success of students in these competitions can

elevate the teachers' reputations and marketability" (ATCG, pg. 8).

GMTA and any affiliate sponsoring a competition may charge non-member teachers and students higher fees

than those of its members and still be FTC antitrust compliant. However, "the fee differential should not be so

high that it effectively compels a teacher to join the MTNA, GMTA or its local affiliates" (ATCG, pg. 9). GMTA

is in the process of implementing such a schedule of fees for non-members who wish to participate in GMTA

Piano Judges List: Yumi Patterson

Technology: Joe Lozier.

Putting the GATE Theory Test online is being evaluated. It would really help to have the applications on line. Cobb County Association has their application process online and stated that it could easily be applied on the state level.

GEORGIA AUDITIONS THEORY EXAMS (GATES)

The committee is still processing and analyzing the tests & results and will publish a report for all GMTA members to read in an upcoming GMTA newsletter.

The graded tests from Spring 2015 will be returned to the Local Associations to distribute to the individual teachers.

Preliminary observations:

- $q\Box$ A few test questions were problematic and were invalidated. They would not have counted against any student's grade.
- Response: The committee will strive to craft questions that are as clear and focused as possible.
- q□ Levels A & B were largely OK and will only need minor edits for next year.
- q□ Level C is under heavier review & will be revised based on what the committee is learning from the trial run this past spring.
- q□ Overall, between 25-29% of students did NOT score at least an 80 on their exam and would not have qualified to advance to regional auditions. The committee believes there are several reasons for this:
- Not taking the test seriously. This is evidenced in part by many students leaving multiple-choice questions blank rather than at least guessing.

- Not being sufficiently prepared.
- q□ Several Local Associations disregarded instructions from the committee, including how to grade the tests. A few even recalculated the points on the tests, making up their own values for how many points each question was worth.
- NOTE: Had the GATEs not been given as a trial-run, those decisions would have had a drastically negative impact on those LAs' auditions results, most likely invalidating their test results and disqualifying all of their students from Auditions.
- o In response, the GATE committee will establish qualifications for graders and will provide training and certification so that a consistent and uniform result can be assured across all the LAs.
- q□ Next year's GATEs (2015-2016)
- Will again be paper-and-pencil and will be graded by each LA.
- Will be made available in both the fall and spring so that LAs can choose a date that works best in their schedules. To ensure fairness, different versions of the tests will be created and distributed. Mailing dates TBA.
- Exemptions will be enforced. Details are being finalized and will be published on GMTA's website by 6/30/15, including a list of all students who have earned exemptions for each GATE level.
- ALL GATEs must have been administered and graded for each grade level BEFORE the results of that grade level are announced at Local Auditions. If your LA plans to administer the GATEs on the day of its Auditions, you will need to plan accordingly.
- All 12th grade piano and piano concerto Auditions participants must take their GATEs by the date of their LA's Auditions. GATEs will not be administered at either Regional or State Auditions.

NEW BUSINESS

- **1) Action Item:** The FAC proposes that the Website Chair position be eliminated. Web editing and updates are now being done by the Executive Director, with oversight provided by the GMTA President. This item passed.
- **2) Action Item:** The GMTA Procedural Manual states that any GMTA Teacher of the Year who is declared MTNA Teacher of the Year will receive honorary lifetime membership in GMTA. The FAC proposes to expand the criteria used in considering candidates for GMTA honorary lifetime membership as follows: In addition to demonstrating exemplary service to the Association and to the music teaching profession, the candidate must meet one of the following requirements: 1) served as an MTNA officer; 2) designated an MTNA Foundation Fellow. The presentation of honorary lifetime membership must be approved by the FAC and the Executive Board. The bios of current Honorary Lifetime Members will be posted on the Member Honors page of the GMTA website. This item passed.
- **3) Action Item:** The FAC proposes that a statement regarding the Code of Ethics be placed on the GMTA Website. It will include a link to the MTNA Code of Ethics and/or the actual MTNA Code of Ethics wording. Local Associations are encouraged to make the same statement on their websites and in their bylaws, procedural manuals and/or directories. Recommended wording: Name of Local Association members shall abide by the current Music Teachers National Association Code of Ethics. This item passed.
- **4) Action Item:** The Finance and Advisory Committee proposes the fee structure for non-member participation in GMTA Auditions. Addendum to the proposal: The teacher must be a member by the application deadline or the non-member fee will be assessed. (Need new wording.) This item passed.
- **5) Action Item:** The FAC proposes the purchase of the following office equipment: Quickbooks software program at a cost of \$379.99; a one-year subscription renewal of Microsoft Office (\$99.99); and a new color

printer/scanner not to exceed \$500.00. These funds will come from the Office Supply portion of the current budget. This item passed.

- **6) Action Item:** The FAC proposes a \$500 bonus for Executive Director, Mandy Reynolds. This item passed.
- **7) Action Item:** The FAC proposes the 2015-2016 GMTA Budget. This is attached to these minutes, The budget was approved as presented.
- **8)** President Engleman proposed that the revised constitution and bylaws for Gwinett County be approved. This passed with two opposed.

Two copies of each local association's constitution and bylaws need to be sent to the GMTA Office.

Any changes in constitution and bylaws need to be presented in writing to the Executive Committee in the future.

- **9)** A motion was made that the Executive Committee grant Past President Dawn McCord the authority to read through the Constitution and Bylaws of each local association and present her recommendations to the Executive Committee at the August 2015 meeting. The motion was made by Susan Andrews and seconded by Jane Lester. This motion passed.
- **10)** A motion was made by Susan Andrews that an Ad Hoc Committee be established to deal with audition challenges and issues. This committee would be made up of Jonathan Klein, Chair, Linda Dorsey, Keiko Ransom, Carol Roach, Cathy Thacker, Rebekah Healan, and Robin Engleman. Joy Poole seconded this motion. This motion was passed.

President Engleman read a letter from Susan Naylor of Reinhardt College apologizing for withdrawing from hosting the 2016 GMTA Conference.

The meeting adjourned at 1:10 PM.
