2011 TEACHER OF THE YEAR DAVID WATKINS

At the GMTA 2011 Conference, David Watkins was presented as the recipient of our Teacher of the Year Award. The Teacher of the Year Award is presented to the candidate who most clearly demonstrates a strong commitment to the music teaching profession and Watkins is that outstanding Georgia candidate for the MTNA Teacher of the Year award. Watkins' love of piano was evident in his formative years when he entered a piano and organ store in Hapeville, Georgia and asked for lessons in exchange for answering the phone, taking out the trash, and cleaning. Watkins remembers these events warmly giving thanks and acknowledgement to the teachers who nurtured, mentored and inspired him. Betty Reed Moore and Llewellyn Scott Moore taught him the importance of professional membership in addition to providing a strong music foundation. Moore's involvement in the Piano Guild and Scott's involvement in GMTA and GMEA gave Watkins opportunities for auditions and

performance. Watkins affirms the importance of this professional experience:

I have encouraged my students to become involved with GMTA and other organizations because I want them and their students to have the same opportunities for growth and networking that have been available to me through the efforts of those who supported GMTA before me. I am proud to say that several of my former students have served, or are currently serving as officers in local chapters of GMTA. Several of my former students are currently on faculties of colleges and universities. Others have well-established private studios, and whose students are participating in GMTA auditions.

Watkins continued his involvement in professional organizations throughout his career. His service has included being a member of MTNA since 1974; serving as 1994-1996 GMTA President and 1988-1990 Vice President of Programs; member of the Cobb County Music Teachers Association since 1980; and, repeated terms of service to the Cobb MTA as Auditions Chair and Program Chair. Many musicians around Georgia have met Watkins at the many events he has adjudicated.

In addition to his personal piano studio and Jim Scott Studios, Watkins has taught at the following institutions and events: the Eastern Music Festival, Georgia College and State University, Kennesaw State University, and Emory University. His performances include numerous solo recitals, collaborative recitals, concerto performances, lecture recitals and premiere performances of works by Sherr, Underwood, Anderson, and Everett. The mark of a teacher's success can be measured by the teacher's students and their activities; students that exit the teacher's studio choose the paths cleared during sound tutelage. Five of Watkins' students are now higher education professors. Other students have won numerous awards and scholarships through events sponsored by GMTA, Georgia Music Educators Association, and the Atlanta Steinway Society. Robert Henry was a fourth prize winner in the 1999 Ibla Grand Prize International Piano Competition in Sicily, Italy; First Prize in the Clara Wells National Piano Scholarship Competition at Penn State; and, MTNA-Young Chang Collegiate Artist Piano Competition. His students are frequent participants in master classes.



Friends and past students are happy to applaud Watkins' performance and pedagogical gifts. Wayne Gibson, past GMTA President, says, "I have heard more than thirty of Mr. Watkins' concerts over the years, including his Carnegie Hall debut and a dozen or more performances with Orchestra. He is an outstanding soloist, accompanist and chamber musician." Robert Henry reports:

Years ago, when I was but an aspiring concert pianist, I wanted a 'conservatory experience' while staying close to home, and I realized that such an experience was possible within his studio. Under his guidance, I have personally achieved international acclaim, having won the gold medal in four international Piano Competitions, and making my own Carnegie Hall debut in 2002. My years with Prof. Watkins were pivotal, and he provided the foundation for my ongoing success.

The 2011 Annual Business Meeting of the Georgia Music Teachers Association was called to order at 3:00 p.m. in the Legacy Hall of the Schwob School of Music at Columbus State University. President DeFoor welcomed the GMTA membership to the conference.

Greetings by MTNA President Benjamin Caton

President DeFoor introduced MTNA President Ben Caton, who presented greetings from the Music Teachers National Association.

Demonstration/Recital

Kristen Hansen presented a demonstration/recital on the Jordan Concert Organ in Legacy Hall. Dr. Hansen performed *Even Song* by John La Montaine and *Kömm, Gott Schöpfer, BWV 667* by J. S. Bach.

Approval of Minutes of 2010 Annual Business Meeting

Dawn McCord had a motion to approve the minutes from the 2010 GMTA Annual Business Meeting. Motion passed.

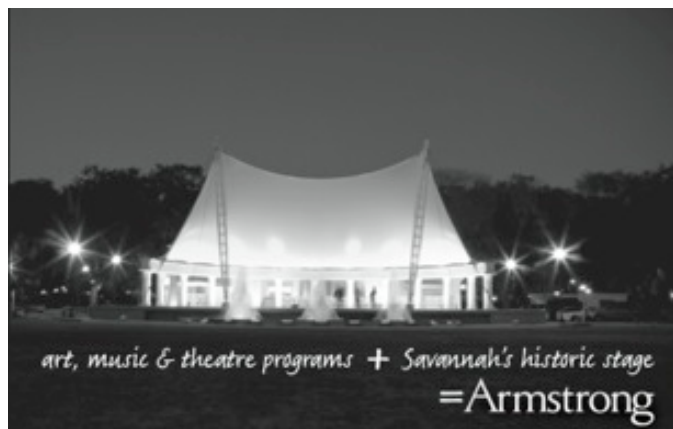
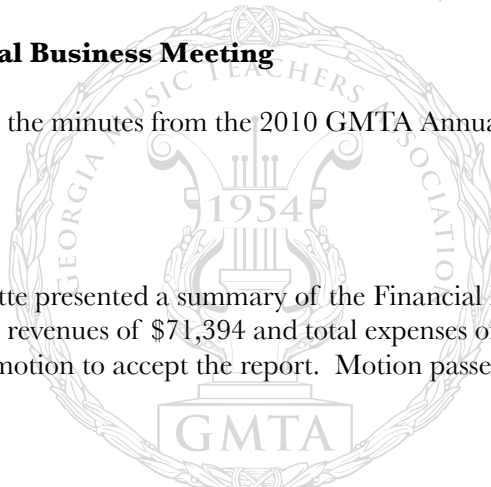
Approval of Financial Report

GMTA Executive Director Donna Trivette presented a summary of the Financial Report compiled by Haley and Associates, showing, for 2010-2011, total revenues of \$71,394 and total expenses of \$67,131, resulting in a net surplus of \$4,263. Susan Naylor had a motion to accept the report. Motion passed.

President's Report

The past year has been very productive for the Georgia Music Teachers Association.

In January 2011, GMTA hosted the MTNA Southern Division Meeting and Competitions at the Schwob School of Music at Columbus State University. At the Southern Division Competition, GMTA had four winners, one alternate, and two honorable mentions. Matthew Shipes, student of David Zerkel, was the winner in the Young Artist Brass Competition. Jasmine Habersham, student of Matthew Hoch, was the winner in the Young Artist Voice Competition. Alex Kim, student of Gayle Vann, was the winner in the Elementary Composition Competition.



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Liliya Ygan, student of Fred Cohen, was the winner of the Young Artist Composition Competition. The winners traveled to Milwaukee in March to the MTNA National Conference. Jasmine Habersham was awarded third place in the MTNA Young Artist Voice Performance Competition. Matthew Shipes was awarded second place in the MTNA Young Artist Brass Performance Competition. Liliya Ygan was the winner of the MTNA Young Artist Composition Competition.

In March, the 2011 MTNA Conference in Milwaukee in March was attended by several GMTA members. It was a wonderful conference which featured great sessions and recitals. The 2012 MTNA Conference will be in New York City. I hope many of our GMTA members will attend this conference, which will be a wonderful opportunity for profession growth and personal enrichment.

The GMTA Auditions were held April 15-16 at Kennesaw University under the supervision of VP/GMTA Auditions, Rebekah Jones. There were a total of 568 participants. Participants included 452 Pre-College Piano, 5 High School Piano Concerto, 35 College Piano, 33 High School and College Voice, 29 K-College Strings, eight Brass and Woodwinds, and six Instrumental Concerto participants. GMTA Theory Achievement Testing continues to grow under the leadership of Jason Bennett. In 2010-2011, 255 students took the theory exam, representing a 5% increase from the previous year. GMTA thanks David Watkins and Kennesaw State University for hosting our GMTA Auditions in 2011. The 2012 GMTA Auditions will be held at Columbus State University.

This spring, an ad hoc committee was appointed to study the structure of our GMTA Auditions. Our very successful GMTA Auditions have simply grown to the point that very few institutions have the capacity to host the event. For example, at the most recent GMTA Auditions at Kennesaw State University this past April, 17 competition rooms were used simultaneously! The committee will make recommendations to the Executive Board in early 2012. Any changes to the GMTA Spring Audition structure will not take place prior to 2013. Serving on the committee are Rebekah Jones (chair), Jan Adams, Glen Eckman, Kevin Hampton, George Mann, and Dawn McCord.

As you know, spring storms this year caused tremendous damage in the southern United States, particularly in Alabama. The Alabama Music Teachers Association established a Tornado Recovery/Music Replacement Fund to assist music teachers and students who suffered loss. GMTA contributed \$1,000 to the Alabama MTA Tornado Recovery/Music Replacement Fund. Many other state and local associations contributed to this fund, and MTNA, through the MTNA Foundation Fund, provided a matching contribution of \$5,000.

The way in which music teacher associations came together to provide this important assistance is very impressive and speaks to the spirit of our organizations.

In an effort to meet many teachers where they are, a GMTA Facebook page was approved and published at the April Executive Board Meeting. The GMTA Facebook page has more than 100 "likes", has generated a large amount of traffic, and has proven to be a very healthy way to promote GMTA.

This summer the Finance Advisory Committee voted to update the GMTA logo. Jonathan Klein chaired this project, which resulted in a logo which is true to the character of our historic logo yet has color and clearer, more precise lines. The Executive Board approved the update of the logo during its August meeting. We are thrilled with the updated logo!

This summer and fall, Jonathan Klein, Co-Vice President for Publicity, and Jenny Bailey, Website Chair, spearheaded an update of the GMTA website. The website update includes the following: an updated look to all the pages and menus, a reorganization of content that makes accessibility easier, a Paypal feature for GMTA donations, advertisements, and conference registration, new photos for the homepage slideshow, and a link to our Facebook page. The website update will be presented at the banquet tonight.

The GMTA/MTNA Performance Competitions were held this week at the Schwob School of Music at Columbus State University campus under the supervision of Lyle Indergaard, VP/Competitions. There were 89 solo entrants, two Senior Piano duets and six chamber ensembles in the Performance Competitions.

The GMTA/MTNA Composition Competitions were administered by Russell Brown. This year, Georgia had 7 entrants in the Composition Competitions.

From the GMTA/MTNA Competitions, 11 solo winners, one piano duet, two chamber ensembles, and three composition winners will represent GMTA in the MTNA Southern Division Competitions in January 2012 at Mississippi College in Clinton, Mississippi.

As of 15 October 2011, GMTA has 688 members. The number of professional and senior members is 662; number of student members is 26; number of certified members is 121 (increase of 10). The number of registrants for our 2011 conference is 121.

As of 15 October 2011, the GMTA bank balance is \$16,945.75. The balance in the GMTA reserve fund is \$65,356.21. The amount in the GMTA Composition Award Fund is \$7,608.28. The amount in the GMTA Broadhurst Award Fund is \$12,208.49 and the amount in the GMTA Award Fund is \$9,835.51.

Again, I hope you are enjoying your time at the 2011 GMTA Conference. An undertaking such as a state conference requires the effort of many individuals. Thank you to the following people for making the 2011 GMTA Conference happen:

The 2011 Conference was held at Columbus State University's Schwob School of Music in Columbus, Georgia, November 3-5. Over 120 GMTA members registered and attended the conference. Dr. Ben Caton, MTNA President, was the guest speaker at the Friday evening banquet. Following the banquet, William DeVan, our Conference Artist Recitalist, offered a varied program of works by Debussy, Barber and Liszt. Mr. DeVan delivered a virtuosic performance throughout his program. His playing demonstrated a command of the keyboard both from an interpretive standpoint and in terms of a wide range of dynamics and broad color palette. In short, his playing was visceral and enthusiastically received at its conclusion with a standing ovation from the audience. The Saturday morning master class was inspiring as Mr. DeVan, with his gentle demeanor, had many constructive comments for the students who participated.

Dennis Alexander, our Conference Pedagogy Headliner, presented two informative lectures; the first one on **“Teaching the Romantics to Young Pianists”**. His discussion centered on how to achieve necessary musical elements that create a convincing performance. Mr. Alexander explained methods to develop a sense of romantic “style” in early level pieces, for example, by using easy duets which lend themselves to rubato and beautiful cantabile playing for the primo player. In his second presentation, **“Why Didn't I Think of That?”** Mr. Alexander discussed answers to many questions that have been asked by piano teachers—among these; dealing with technique, rhythm, memorization, and teaching adults.

Numerous topics from **“Georgia's Own”** Presenters provided a wide range of sessions to choose from. A presentation by Rebekah Jordan-Miller explored intermediate repertoire of the **Twentieth and Twenty-first centuries from European, Canadian and American composers** and introduced extended contemporary techniques found in some of this repertoire. Pam Asberry offered a presentation on **Teaching the Transfer Student** in which she discussed assessing skill levels, choosing teaching material, and keeping motivation high. Dawn Dalangin gave a very informative session on the advantages of **incorporating group lessons into the private piano studio**. Benefits of these lessons include building confidence, fostering leadership skills, and collaborative thinking. **“How to Develop a Perfect Memory”** which was presented by Dr. Priscilla Jefcoat, discussed the left brain and right brain as they relate to music memorization techniques. Kevin Hampton lectured on **Neglected Treasures: Impromptus, Mazurkas and Nocturnes**, focusing on lesser known works by composers in these genres. After offering a brief structural analysis, Dr. Hampton insightfully performed pieces by eight composers not usually associated with these genres. A session on the **Well-Tempered Body**, presented by Ipek Brooks dealt with **E. J. Dalcroze's Eurhythmics**. The presentation focused on how we can incorporate “Eurhythmics” activities (a way of teaching/learning rhythm through body movement) into our private piano teaching. Dr. Evren Kutlay-Baydar's topic, **Piano Music in 19th Century Ottoman Istanbul** discussed the westernization movement in the 19th century Ottoman Empire. Using selected recorded examples, compositions during this period were shared with the audience. Another session presented by John Stonko was **Studio Marketing: Increasing Your Student Base**. Solid and effective strategies for increasing book of business were included in Dr. Stonko's presentation. Dr. Laura Gordy explored five elements that contribute to expressive playing in any style in her presentation **5 Steps to Beautiful Phrasing in any Style**. A session exploring **A Fresh Approach to Traditional Technical Exercises** was presented by Jerico Vasquez. Dr. Vasquez discussed creative approaches to Hanon and Philipp with the goal of leading to greater independence of the fingers by releasing tension.

On Thursday evening in Legacy Hall, GMTA Members heard a wonderful performance by the Columbus State University Philharmonic and Concerto Winners. Yubo Su, piano and Laura Pereira, violin were the featured soloists. The orchestra, led by its marvelous Music Director and Conductor, Paul Hostetter, provided solid collaborative support. The concluding work on the program was an outstanding performance of “An American in Paris”. The orchestra performed at an exemplary level during the entire evening's concert and received an enthusiastic ovation at the conclusion of the program.

At the Friday afternoon General Session, attendees were treated to a brief concert by Kristen Hansen, Organist, who demonstrated the wide-ranging capabilities of Legacy Hall's magnificent pipe organ.

Facilitating the many events and presentations were 13 Presiders who offered greetings and support to each of the Presenters. The RiverCenter South Lobby was the perfect space for those in attendance who enjoyed social interaction with fellow GMTA colleagues. The 2011 Conference afforded every attendee opportunities for immersion in sessions that were both educational and inspirational, reenergizing an excitement for our profession.

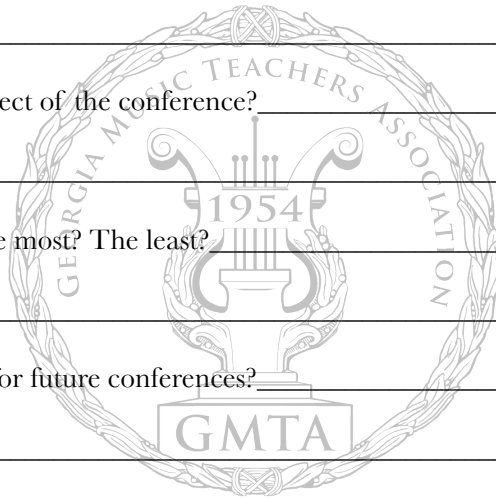

The Conference Recital for the 2011 GMTA Annual Conference was presented by William DeVan, Steinway Artist and Presenter and Artist-in-Residence Emeritus at Birmingham-Southern College. He has performed all over the world since the early 1980's when he became head of the piano faculty at Birmingham-Southern. Most recently, he has performed in Xiamen, Shanghai, Paris and Tulsa.

Mr. DeVan opened his recital with three pieces by Debussy: Prelude "La Cathédrale engloutie," Prelude "La terrasse des audiences du clair de lune" and Etude "pour les Arpèges composés." From the calm tone colors of the Preludes to the polytexture of the Etude, DeVan was in full command of his performance. In researching these pieces, I found it interesting to find that, in addition to the fact that the Sunken Cathedral depicts legendary cathedral of Ys and its tolling bells, the Terrace of Spectators by the Light of the Moon comes from a newspaper account of the coronation of George Vas as Emperor of India in 1912.

Mr. DeVan followed the Debussy with Samuel Barber's Sonata, Opus 26. He performed this difficult virtuosic showpiece with commanding versatility. Again, a little history of which I was not aware – Barber's only sonata was written in 1949 for the twenty-fifth anniversary of the League of Composers (now League of Composers/ISCM) and was first performed by Vladimir Horowitz at the request of the composer.


Following the intermission we were treated to an assortment of Liszt pieces: from the beautiful flowing water of "Les Jeux d'eaux à la Villa d'Este," to the somber "Funérailles," an elegy written in response to the loss of three of his friends in the failed Hungarian uprising against Hapsburg rule in 1848, to the pre-impressionistic sounds of "Etude d'exécution transcendante 'Harmonies du Soir' ", to the passionate and dramatic "Mephisto Waltz."

GMTA was most fortunate to have been able to hear William DeVan play in Columbus State University's magnificent Legacy Hall.

I have been told by some potential certification candidates that they don't know why they need to go through the certification process. This summer I read the following article in the *American Music Teacher* (June/July 2011, p. 41). I thought it gave a good answer to one NCTM's questions, so I obtained permission from the author. Thanks, Linda!

After The Honeymoon: An MTNA Certification Story

I have just passed the one-year anniversary for MTNA certification. I began this journey by asking myself, "What does certification mean to me, to my students, to my colleagues?" In the beginning, I honestly didn't think it would matter to my students. I could see the value it had in relation to my colleagues and also to me as a lifelong learner, but my students just wanted music lessons to be fun and exciting. What I didn't know at the time, however, was that the certification process would lead me on a musical journey that had great potential to widen my view of fun and exciting lessons. I just had to make the decision to get on the train.

I didn't fit the mold of the typical MTNA applicant. The train was uncomfortable, and it wasn't made for people like me. Like any good musician who is inclined to improvise, I resisted the structure it required. But I had a curiosity about the trip, and I was eager to see new things and to bring back presents for my students, so I finally made the decision to go. I'm really glad I did, and I would encourage others to do so, too.

Here are some of the beautiful gems I gathered: courage to implement new ideas into my teaching, an expansion of my knowledge of piano literature, an educational philosophy that was clarified more than I ever imagined, an enriched knowledge of practical studio policies and an inspiring vision of my future as a music educator. Wow, was I surprised! I never expected to receive these gifts, and I never expected to be in a position to offer them to my students. Now when I ask myself "Did certification matter to my students?" I am dumbfounded by the resounding "YES!" I had no idea what good things were in store for me, and consequently for my students.

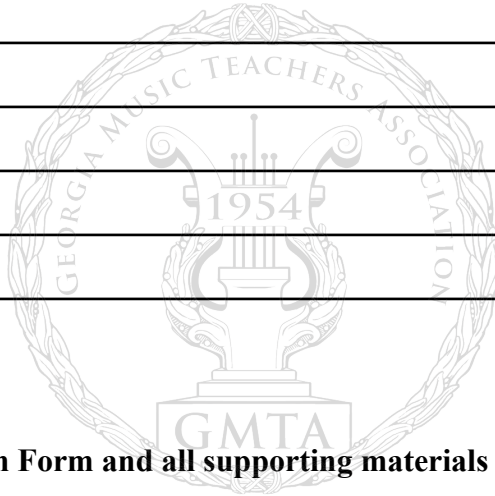
