Vice President | GMTA Program

A wide array of presentations awaits those who will be attending the 2011 Fall Conference at Columbus State University, November 3-5. We are pleased that Dennis Alexander will present pedagogy sessions. He is one of the world's most prolific and popular composers of educational piano music for students at all levels. Over the years, Mr. Alexander has been a clinician at state and national music teachers conventions. In 2009, he was invited by MTNA to conduct the intermediate level master class at their national convention in Atlanta. One session will explore the musical elements that create convincing performances of romantic repertoire, and another presentation will delve into questions regarding technique, motivation, repertoire, sight-reading, memorization, rhythm and other issues that every teacher must deal with regardless of the level of the student. There will also be an "Alfred Showcase" highlighting new materials from Alfred Publishing Co.

Our conference recitalist and master class headliner is William DeVan of Birmingham-Southern College, where he has been head of the piano faculty since 1980. Mr. DeVan won first prize in the international piano competition "Vianna da Motta" in Lisbon, Portugal in 1975. He has been soloist with the Zagreb Philharmonic, Croatia, and has performed in Australia. Every other year since 1999, he has performed in Paris, France, most recently in January, 2011. In addition, he has appeared in numerous recital appearances in Germany, China, and Taiwan. DeVan now travels throughout the United States giving concerts and piano workshops sponsored by Steinway. In June 2004, he was named "Teacher of the Year" by the Alabama Music Teachers Association at their annual convention. A winner of two Mellon Foundation Grants, he is co-author of Schumann: *Solo Piano Literature*, a comprehensive guide to the works of Robert Schumann.

Melinda Clark is our commissioned composer this year. She is composing an original 4-movement work which will be premiered by Ray and Beth Chenault, duo-organists, during the General Meeting. Currently Melinda serves as Organist and Director of Music and the Arts at North Avenue Presbyterian Church, Atlanta GA. She has been commissioned to write musical works for churches, cabarets, storytellers, and the music track for a video produced by Atlanta-based *Storytime*, *Inc.* The Chenaults' frequent performances throughout the United States and Europe have garnered critical acclaim in numerous reviews, and they have been featured artists at conferences and conventions of the American Guild of Organists, the American Society for Eighteenth-Century Studies, and in Charleston during the Spoleto Festival.

Registration for the conference is required. Indeed, a varied slate of topics will be available for all teachers who attend the Fall Conference. I am looking forward to seeing everyone in Columbus.

In conjunction with the 2011 GMTA Conference, the Georgia Chapter of the National Association of Singing (NATS) will present a two-day master class by Jeannette LoVetri on Friday, November 4 from 2:00pm-5:00pm and Saturday, November 5 from 10:00am-1:00pm at the Columbus State University Schwob School of Music. The focus of the master class is the musical theatre singing as well as teaching the younger singer.


Jeannette LoVetri is Visiting-Artist-in-Residence at Shenandoah Conservatory and the founder of the first program on Contemporary Commercial Music (formerly called "non-classical) at the Conservatory, which is in Winchester, Virginia. The Contemporary Commercial Music Vocal Pedagogy Institute at Shenandoah was created in 2003 to address the needs of 21st century singing and teaching.

Ms. LoVetri is a Past President of The New York Singing Teachers' Association (NYSTA) and teaches the Music Theater Pedagogy segment of their Professional Development Program. She is also a member of the New York City Chapter of The National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS) and the American Academy of Teachers of Singing.

Ms. Lovetri has worked for many years in liaison with noted medical and clinical specialists retraining injured singing voices. She was one of the first singing consultants at the Grabscheid Voice Center at Mt. Sinai Medical Center in New York City, working there under Dr. Peak Woo. She also consulted at The New York Eye and Ear Infirmary with Dr. Lucian Sulica and Alison Behrman, PhD., and Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center with Thomas Murry, PhD., while he was there, all also in New York City.






