

FROM THE PRESIDENT

In the 1942 movie *Yankee Doodle Dandy* we hear, "My mother thanks you. My father thanks you. My sister thanks you. And I thank you," Let me add that I thank you, Jan Adams thanks you, and GMTA members thank you for another successful **Auditions**. We even saw an increase in participation. I helped with the Region V Auditions and families seemed pleased with the experience. One parent approached me at the event to tell me that she has been involved with Auditions for 6 years and she thinks that the Regional events are fantastic providing the opportunity for more judge feedback and awards. She wished her other children could have had this opportunity. As with other GMTA initiatives, this is a continually evolving event and will always be evaluated and fine-tuned in order to foster an experience that is valued by teachers and participants. We will continue to repeat that which is working great and seek ways to improve on all things.

On a critical and time-sensitive note, we must devote time to the order of the **Federal Trade Commission** (FTC). All Local Association presidents should have received a copy of the FTC Order with instructions on how to comply. We have addressed this issue at the GMTA Conference in November with a change in our By-Laws voted in by our membership. We also had a productive discussion on the FTC Order at the Executive Board meeting this past April. Many of the Local Associations have already done this work and it is just a matter of reading the newly released Order to ensure that nothing is different than what we predicted prior to the official FTC Order. For those who have not reviewed their By-Laws, Policies and Procedures, and Website to check for compliance, now is the time to do this. As soon as you have made those revisions, complete the Compliance form and submit it to MTNA as requested. **The due date is August 28, 2014**. If by chance, you still need to make a change and need more time, file an extension right away. Presidents should have received all of this information as attachments (FTC Order, Compliance Form, Extension Form) If not, check to see that we have the correct President listed on the GMTA website. Sometimes, we are not notified of changes. If that is the case, send me the current President's name and preferred email and I will make the necessary corrections. As always, contact me if you have questions and we will find the answer you need. Failure to comply and submit the paper work will result in the offending Local Association being disaffiliated with MTNA. GMTA is also working to ensure that we are in compliance. As to the genesis of this investigation, I am sure that MTNA and all state and local affiliates have not instituted any acts with malice or intent to block trade in our service to music and students but in order to make this clear, all states are required to do this work. To put this in a positive light, I suggest you take this opportunity to update your By-Laws, Policies and Procedures, and website in all areas. This makes it a win-win for everyone.


As a testament to our good works, I would like to share some impressive information, much of what is reported in this newsletter but here are a few items to wet your whistle. I worked with the great MTNA-GA **Competition** team under the leadership of David George. We had 94 entrants with only one other state having 6 more competitors. Of the 21 GMTA Competition Winners that continued on to the Southern Division Competition, 17 received a rating of Winner, Alternate, or Honorable Mention in Louisville. I joined the MTNA-GA winners at the Southern Division Meetings Competitions at the University of Louisville. Louisville, Kentucky, January 17-20, 2014. I served as an indoor monitor for two events and was fortunate to hear our Chamber Wind competitors who won in their competition. I was very proud to claim them as our own along with all of our participants in other competitions. Our state garnered many wins. The winners represented us at the MTNA Conference in Chicago, Illinois. Of the Division Winners from Georgia, 8 students (Senior Piano Duet, Chamber Winds, Young Artist String and Young Artist Brass) were recognized with second and third place national awards. Kudos go out to the teachers in Georgia and their wonderful students.

At the national MTNA Conference, I attended the MTNA Foundation GALA, meetings and forums dedicated to meeting the goals of our organization as well as hearing many fine performances and master classes. At the conference business meeting, Mary Ann Knight and Helen Ramsaur were recognized with the 50-year Member Award. Besides being a witness to the worth of MTNA membership, both of these young ladies have influenced many of today's GMTA teachers. The number of winners generated by Mary Ann and Helen in the competitions and auditions, is stunning. Maybe this witness will encourage you to get your membership in early for the coming year. The target date for **renewing or joining MTNA/GMTA** is June 30. We pull our data for the online GMTA directory from MTNA so don't let your name be dropped. The directory is updated twice a month and for those using the "Find a Teacher," the same data is used.

Intense planning is already in progress for the **2014 GMTA Conference**. I have traveled to Clayton State University to meet with VP of Programs, Susan Tusing. She and I met with the 2014 Commissioned Composer and performers as well as reviewed plans for facilities and logistics. We have great headliners, Jennifer Linn and Richard Goode, on board along with the MTNA President Kenneth Christensen and Southern Division Director Marc Hebda. I hope that you have already marked your calendars, Nov. 6-8, for the next conference. Our conference is a quality experience along with a bargain.

Revel in the good we are doing in the state of Georgia, renew your membership, comply with FTC order, and remember to thank your parents for the time and money they invest in their child's music studies. "My mother thanks you. My father thanks you. My sister thanks you. And I thank you."

Plans for the 2014 GMTA Conference are starting to take shape, and this year's Conference promises to be an exciting one. The Conference will be on the campus of Clayton State University in Morrow, co-hosted by Spivey Hall. We will celebrate GMTA's 60th Anniversary, and MTNA President Kenneth J. Christensen and Southern Division Director Marc Hebda will be in attendance.

Internationally-acclaimed pianist Richard Goode will be our Conference Recitalist and Master Class Artist. Richard Goode has been hailed for music-making of tremendous emotional power, depth, and expressiveness, and he has been acknowledged worldwide as one of today's leading interpreters of Classical and Romantic music. A native of New York, Richard Goode studied with Elvira Szigeti and Claude Frank, with Nadia Reisenberg at the Mannes College of Music, and with Rudolf Serkin at the Curtis Institute. He has won many prizes, including the Young Concert Artists Award, First Prize in the Clara Haskil Competition, the Avery Fisher Prize, and a Grammy Award. His remarkable interpretations of Beethoven came to national attention when he played all five concerti with the Baltimore Symphony under David Zinman, and when he performed the complete cycle of sonatas at New York's 92nd Street Y and Kansas City's Folly Theater. In addition to his concertizing, Mr. Goode is on the piano faculty of the Mannes College of Music in New York and serves with Mitsuko Uchida as co-Artistic Director of the Marlboro Music School and Festival in Marlboro, Vermont. Mr. Goode records under the Nonesuch label.

Our Pedagogy Headliner will be Jennifer Linn. Ms. Linn is a multi-talented pianist, teacher, composer, arranger, and clinician, and holds the title of Manager-Educational Piano for Hal Leonard Corporation. In addition to her contributions to the *Hal Leonard Student Piano Library*, her work includes creating and editing the newly released *Journey Through the Classics* series. Ms. Linn also was the editor and recording artist for the G. Schirmer Performance Editions *Clementi: Sonatinas, Op. 36, Kuhlau: Selected Sonatinas*, and *Schumann: Selections from Album for the Young, Op. 68*. Many of her original compositions have been selected for the National Federation of Music Clubs festival list and are frequently recommended in reviews by *Clavier Companion* and *American Music Teacher* magazines. Ms. Linn was commissioned to compose a collaborative work for the 2013 MTNA National Conference in Anaheim, California where her trio *Serendipity* for piano, flute and horn, was premiered.

Sharon Willis, Chair of the Department of Music at Clark Atlanta University, is our commissioned composer. Her compositions include arrangements of spirituals, cantatas, orchestral tone poems, and organ works. Dr. Willis was commissioned by The American Guild of Organists to write an organ suite for the AGO's Chicago Conference in 2006. She has written several operas, both libretti and music. Her first, *The Opera Singer*, focuses on casting obstacles facing African-American singers in the field of opera. For the GMTA Conference, Dr. Willis has composed a programmatic work for organ, piano, and soprano, and the premiere will be performed by Alex Benford (Clayton State University), Elena Cholakova (Emory University), and Jane Redding (University of West Georgia).

The 2014 GMTA Concerto Winners will perform with the Southern Crescent Symphony Orchestra and Clayton State University Orchestra on Thursday night. The orchestra concert will also feature a concert performance of excerpts of Gilbert and Sullivan's *H.M.S. Pinafore*, sung by members of Clayton State's Music Drama Workshop.

As always, the conference will include several informative sessions by Georgia's Own. The final schedule of Georgia's Own sessions will be available later on the GMTA website.

I look forward to seeing a large gathering of members for what I know will be an inspiring conference. I would love to hear from members who are interested in serving as presiders to welcome and assist the presenters. GMTA THEORY ACHIEVEMENT TESTS 2013-2014 RESULTS

This year, <u>281</u> theory tests were taken by students studying with <u>54</u> of our members. Of those 281 tests, <u>159 (58%) earned a 90 or above</u>, and <u>36 scored a perfect 100!</u> It is always exciting to see the success of so many students who prepared for the theory tests.

As always, I am grateful for the members of the theory committee, each of whom works diligently to maintain the excellence of the theory tests: Diane Boyd, Dr. Priscilla Jefcoat, B.J. Sutherland, & Gayle Vann. This year in particular, I owe a special thanks to Diane Boyd and Gayle Vann for going above and beyond the call of duty to be sure the quality of our theory testing program remained high. I also deeply appreciate both the current and incoming administrations' support, particularly President Dawn McCord and President-Elect Robin Engleman, and their ongoing commitment to the importance of teaching music theory to our students.





The GMTA Collegiate Chapters Facebook page was launched in October, 2013. Several announcements have been posted from MTNA, University of Georgia, Shorter University and Reinhardt University. So far we have 53 likes.

Two collegiate chapters made presentations at the 2013 GMTA State Conference. The Shorter University chapter presented a full session titled "Piano Student CPR: Innovative Repertoire to Rejuvenate Your Pianist's Playing" and the Reinhardt University chapter presented acts from their upcoming comedy recital for one of the Presto sessions.

The first-ever GMTA collegiate chapters meeting was held during the 2013 GMTA State Conference, with 16 members, 3 faculty advisors and 1 guest in attendance. I have not followed up on these suggestions due to time constraints.

No new collegiate chapters have been organized during the past year. I will continue to send emails to Georgia colleges and universities in hopes that new collegiate chapters will be organized during the coming year.


